### **Frequently Asked Questions**

- Q: Does a professional need to bring their own equipment?
- A: RAM provides a turn-key clinic experience, so there is no need to bring your own equipment. Please contact the RAM Volunteer Team with specific requests at volunteers@ramusa.org.
- Q: What do we do in the event of cataracts, glaucoma, or other issues we cannot address at the clinic?
- A: RAM works with our community partners to connect patients to follow-up care after the clinic.
- Q: What happens in the event of a medical emergency?
- A: RAM Clinic Leadership will take over and activate the appropriate response plan.
- Q: What are the clinic working hours?
- A: Hours vary clinic by clinic. Most clinics start at 6 a.m. and continue into the afternoon. Any time commitment you can make is greatly appreciated.
- Q: How is RAM funded?
- A: RAM is a 501(c)(3) non-profit that is funded by private donors, foundations, and grants. No government funding is used for clinic operations.

## **Vision Overview**

To create a smooth clinic experience, RAM brings designated CORE Volunteers (subject matter experts) who supervise each area, support and orient the team, and troubleshoot the equipment.

#### **Patient Processing**

- 1. Patient health screening.
- 2. Patient register and receive a Vision form.
- 3. Medical history and vitals are collected:
  - Patients with a blood pressure greater than 180/100 and or a blood sugar greater than 250 mg/dL, may not receive services and will be sent to the Medical area for additional evaluation.
- 4. Patients proceed to the Vision Area.

#### **Pre-testing**

- The Vision Area is staffed by volunteer:
  - Vision Professionals
  - General Support
- RAM provided equipment includes: Illuminated box, autorefractor, Snellen eye chart and autolensometer
- Pre-testing consists of:
  - 1. Visual acuity using a Snellen eye chart
  - 2. Autorefractor reading
  - 3. Lensometry on old eye wear

Laws vary state by state regarding professionals.

Please check with the RAM Volunteer Team
about licensing compliance.

#### Refracting

- The Refracting Area is staffed by volunteer:
  - Optometry Students (under faculty supervision)
  - Licensed Optometrists
  - Other Optical Professionals (under a prescribing provider)
- RAM provided equipment includes: Phoropters, projectors, and near point cards
- Refracting consists of:
  - 1. Determining prescription to address refractive error.
  - 2. Referring patients for eye health evaluations when indicated.

#### Eye Health Evaluations

- The Vision Lab Area is staffed by volunteer:
  - Optometry Students (under faculty supervision)
  - Licensed Optometrists
  - Ophthalmologists
- RAM provided equipment includes: tonopens, slit lamps, lcare, ocular lenses, tonometers, and indirect ophthalmoscopes
- Eye Health Evaluations consist of:
  - 1. Slit lamp assessment.
  - 2. Checking intraocular pressure.



#### Dispensing

- The Dispensing Area is staffed by volunteer:
  - Opticians
  - Optical Technicians
  - General Support
- RAM provided equipment includes: frame warmer, adjusting tools, autolensometer, manual lensometer and pupilometer
- Dispensing consists of:
  - 1. Coaching patients as they select new frames.
  - 2. Taking measurements for eye wear production.
  - 3. Dispensing new eye wear and readers.

#### RAM Vision Lab

- Staffed with volunteer opticians and general support
- The Vision Lab consists of:
  - 1. Producing single vision and bifocal eyeglasses with CR39 lenses.

#### Supplies and Consumables

- Vision scripts, office supplies, frames, hand sanitizer, alcohol prep pads, phoropter, slit lamp shields, eyeglass cases, and more.
- Cyclopentolate HCI, Phenylephrine HCI, Tropicamide, and Tetracaine HCI drops
- PPE including gloves, masks, Face shields, and goggles.
